

- Mayflower Compact contract in which they agreed to self government and fair laws to protect the general good




Britain begins to make rules to pay for the war against the French and to keep colonists from fighting with the Native Americans.







### If the colonists are Independent from Britain, they needed to make a plan for a government.





Napoleon offered to sell the entire Louisiana Territory to the United States for \$15 million. It doubled the size of the US.


### Era: Westward Expansion 1812-1845
